WHAT IS HFCB

The Hunger Free Campus Bill (HFCB) is a proposal of a law that aims at providing funding to public colleges to address student hunger on college campuses around the United States. The bill was launched by Swipe Out Hunger, a nonprofit organization dedicated to ending hunger on college campuses. With over \$112 million already being distributed to address such hunger, HFCB's success is undeniable. HFCB works state-by-state, meaning the bill has only been introduced in a select few states. HFCB has yet to be introduced to legislators in Georgia, leaving local college students vulnerable to hunger.
